Welcome

Anaphylaxis, Medical Information, Concussions

Some children in our school have life-threatening reactions to certain foods including peanuts and tree nuts. We cannot guarantee that traces of these products aren't found in certain foods, however we are asking for your cooperation in helping keep these children healthy. Please do not send in food items containing peanuts or tree nuts. Check food labels to determine if these items are hidden in products. If your child has a life-threatening allergy and you have not contacted the school, please let us know as soon as possible.

Balloons are also not allowed at our school because of latex allergies.

It is also extremely important for parents/guardians to let the school know if their child has any **other medical condition** that could impact their day to day health. Schools also have **concussion** protocols in place so if your child is being treated for a concussion, please notify the school.

Students should not have prescription or non-prescription medication with them at school. Students requiring medication at school need to have a consent form filled out by their parent/guardian and a medical professional. This medication is then kept in a secure location and administered as required.

<u>Asthma</u>

If you have not already done so, please contact the school as soon as possible if your child has asthma. If you are the parent/guardian of a child with asthma, we need your co-operation in providing us with current medical information and in developing a plan to protect your child.

Students under 16 years of age who have parental permission are permitted to carry their own asthma medication with them at school.

Pizza

Pizza order forms were sent home this week. Orders are due in the office on or before Friday, September 21^{st} . Pizza is served on Wednesdays. The first Pizza Day will be on Wednesday, September 26^{th} .

Milk

Milk will be for sale at second nutrition break each day. Students are encouraged to purchase milk tickets in advance rather than bringing money to school. Tickets are \$9.00 for a sheet of 10. If students do not purchase tickets in advance, the cost is \$1.00 per milk.

School Council meetings are held approximately four times per school year.

Busing

It is also a good idea to inform your child's bus driver if you are aware of upcoming changes. Please also contact the Sudbury Student Services Consortium and inform your child's bus driver if your child has a life-threating allergy, asthma, or any other medical condition that might affect his/her daily health.

 Messages are checked regularly so if it is after hours, please leave us a message. You can also use the Remind messaging system.
- Playground supervision begins at 8:30 am. Students should not arrive at school prior to this time.
- Students walking home for lunch will go at second nutrition break.
 Please contact the school if your child will be going home for lunch on a regular basis. Bus students and students who regularly eat lunch at school will NOT be permitted to leave school property at lunch unless they are signed out by a parent/guardian.

Communication

Little Current Public School uses a variety of methods of communication with our families. Communication is vital for us to work together to help our students be successful.

- 1. Please inform the school if your contact information has changed since last year or if it changes during the year. This information is vital, especially in case of emergency.
- 2. Remind messaging system is used to send messages to parents. You can also use it to notify the secretary for our "Safe Arrival" program if your child will be absent or late.
- We also use newsletters and other print materials, and our Little Current Public School Facebook page. Please be sure to check your child's school bag regularly for communication from the school.

What is Remind? Remind lets educators send quick, simple messages to students and parents on any device—no smartphones necessary. Your personal contact information stays private, and you can access your full message history at any time. Remind is free to use for educators, students, and parents.

You can choose to receive messages via text, email, or both. Your personal information is kept private and the school does not have access to your email or cell phone number.
