Terry Fox Walk

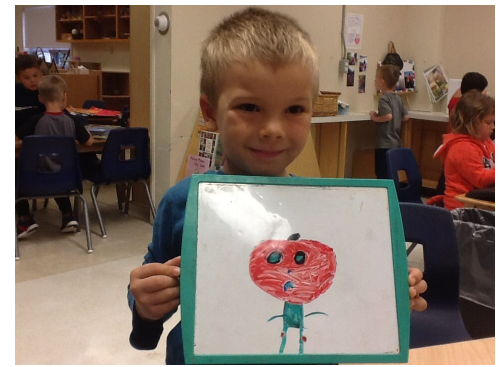
